**“A Focus on Kiddush Hashem:
An Answer to Many of
Our Challenges”**

Jonathan Rosenblum — A native of Chicago, Jonathan Rosenblum has lived in Jerusalem since 1979. Beginning in 1989, he has been a columnist in nearly every major Anglo-Orthodox publication. Today he writes a weekly column for *Mishpacha Magazine* and *Yated Ne’eman* in English. In 1997, Rosenblum became the first regular hareidi columnist in the mainstream Israeli press, when he started writing a weekly column in *The Jerusalem Post*. Besides his twenty-year *The Jerusalem Post* column, Rosenblum has also written for the Hebrew daily *Ma’ariv*, and a host of secular publications, including *Commentary*, *Moment*, and *The Jewish Week*. Rosenblum has been described as “arguably the most widely read and influential hareidi writer in English.”

Rosenblum holds a B.A. from the University of Chicago and a J.D. degree from Yale Law School. Since 1993, Rosenblum has authored ten books, including eight biographies of modern Torah leaders and a work on theodicy. He also served for a decade as director of Jewish Media Resources, a media resource for foreign journalists based in Israel, sponsored by Agudath Israel of America.
